# Changes to the Vet Gateway website – New Location of Instructions and Communications

### **Purpose**

- 1. To provide information on how to find content that has been migrated from the Vet Gateway website to the Improve International OV website, specifically:
- 2. To inform all Official Veterinarians (OVs) how to locate the OV Instructions.
- 3. To inform all OVs authorised under the OCQ(V) CA and SX how to locate the Animal Health Certificates (AHCs).
- 4. To inform all OVs how to find the APHA Briefing Notes and Newsletters.


## **Location of OV Instructions and Animal Health Certificates**

5. To access the OV instructions, open the <a href="Improve International OV website">Improve International OV website</a> and then click on <a href="Instructions">Instructions</a> and <a href="Notifications">Notifications</a>. You will be presented with three options to enable you to view the Instructions, Newsletters or Briefing Notes.

- 6. To locate the OV instructions, click on the **Instructions** link and you will be presented with links to the OV instructions for each work area.
- 7. To locate the AHCs, click on the **Instructions** link. Click the **Exports** work area from the left-hand navigation menu and you will be presented with an option to view the latest updates or the documents at the top of the screen. Click on **See all Exports documents** and it will bring up all the documents for that work area.

8. To access the OV Newsletters and OV Briefing Notes, open the <a href="mailto:limberove">lmprove</a> International OV website and click on Instructions and Notifications and then click on the relevant option.
